1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and doc

Being an affiliated college, the institution is bound to follow the curriculum prescribed by the MJPR University, Bareilly. At the outset, the principal of the college and the coordinator of the IQAC conduct meetings with the various department heads to develop strategies for effective implementation of the curricula prescribed by the University. The Timetable Committee prepares a timetable for all the departments. The heads of departments hold meetings with their faculty members in order to design an effective plan for teaching, preparation of paper and syllabus, and distribution of workload among all the faculty members based on their specialization, teaching experience and other personal factors. The teachers discuss the entire syllabus of the paper assigned to them with the students in the class and suggest relevant books which they can purchase from the market or get issued from the College Library. The teachers guide students to prepare notes not only for the year end University exams but also for the semester exams. The students are also given information about the relevant learning material available on the Internet. The queries raised by the students are immediately attended to and clarified. The students are also encouraged and motivated to hold interaction with the teachers during free periods. After the completion of the syllabus the FAQ in the University exams are discussed with the students. In practical subjects, all the experiments prescribed in the syllabus are carried out under the supervision and guidance of teachers. In science subjects like geography, zoology and botany, field trips are undertaken under the supervision of teachers. Since the college strives to bring the all-round development of students' personality, co-curricular and extracurricular activities are promoted with the help of NCC, NSS and Rovers and Rangers at the college. The faculty members of the college are encouraged to attend and participate in seminars, workshops, conferences and orientation and refresher courses so that they update themselves with the latest trends and techniques to improve their teaching practices. The IQAC monitors the academic activities on a regular basis to ensure the effective implementation of the planning.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Student-centric learning is personalized, engaging, competency-based and is not restricted to the classroom and it is not teacher-centred. In the student-centric teaching-learning process, student is at the centre. In contrast to teacher-centric approaches, SCL engages student as a leader and decision-maker in their own learning. Herein the learner requires individualization, interaction and integration. Individualization ensures that learner is empowered to complete their own activities and select his/her own authentic materials. A learner learns through team learning in which they teach and benefit one another. In this method, student takes greater responsibility for his/her learning and monitors each other's progress, so every student gets the skills that he/she requires to succeed and contribute to society. This method of learning gives student an opportunity to decide two things: what material they learn and how they learn it. Our institute follows experimental, participative, and problem solving learning methodologies for the growth and all round development of learners. While teaching in the classroom, every lesson starts with students' active participation and generally most of the decision making activities are done by them. They participate in the development of the teaching-learning process.

2. Our college will have a water harvesting reservoir for the sake of water conservation, as water is life.
3. Online teaching learning process will be regularised and emphasis will be given in the ensuing session.
4. Covid-19 appropriate behavioural awareness will be promoted among the staff of the Institute and by the students this awareness will be shared for their better safety point of view.
5. To promote the need and importance of sanitation, health and hygiene among students, teachers and community, campus beautification will be strengthened and along with it more plantation will be done for a better oxygenated atmosphere.
6. The main entry gate will be broadened and renovated for better entrance purposes.
7. Library will be renovated and reading room will be furnished well in the ensuing session for better teaching learning outcomes.
